Gymnastics | Grades KG-G5 Master Hao


Room: B5.4 | Cost: 171,000KRW

Bus Schedule

During the ASA season, bus schedules will run as follows:

Standard Bus Routes

- Buses #1, #2, #3, #7, #8, #9
 - Departures: 3:40 PM and 4:40 PM



- Buses #4, #5, #6
 - Long-distance routes (Wondong IC Jangjeon, Seomyeon Choeup, Busan Station) → One departure only at 3:40 PM
 - Students on these routes must make their own way home if joining an ASA
 - Students normally on these routes but living elsewhere will be reassigned to other buses, which run at 3:40 PM and 4:40 PM

Ulsan Route

• Two departures: 3:40 PM and 4:40 PM

Geoje & Jinhae Routes

- · One departure: 4:40 PM
- · Students not joining an ASA may wait at school (e.g., in the library) until departure

Important Reminder:

- Students in ASAs finishing after 4:40 PM should either leave early to catch their bus or make their own way home.
- A detailed bus timetable will be emailed after ASA registration closes.





ASA Registration on SchoolsBuddy

SchoolsBuddy is the management system that ISB uses to allow parents to sign their children up for ASAs. SchoolsBuddy is split up into three containers: Season 1, Season 2, and Season 3. ASA Sign-up typically takes place three weeks before the start of the season to allow families to talk through the available options to make informed decisions. SchoolsBuddy operates using a preference-based sign-up model, which fairly allocates students into their chosen ASAs.



Health & Safety during ASAs

All ASAs are supervised by ISB staff or approved adults, and students are never left alone on campus. A qualified school nurse is available until 4:30 pm, with first aid and emergency procedures in place. Parents will be contacted if needed, ensuring student safety and wellbeing at all times.
